



be taken away to the Big House. Any celebrity he has known in the previous decade is no use to him now. And few who are taken to the Big House ever return.



Church charity for 2023-2025

For the last two years we have been supporting Send a Child to Hucklow. This year we need to choose a new charity to support.

Church Council discussed this at their last meeting. As many of you may know, Springhill Hospice is currently struggling with a shortfall in funding. It's a charity which has supported many people, and which we hope will be able to continue to do so for many years to come.

Our recommendation is therefore that Springhill Hospice be adopted as the next charity we support. This will be a focus of our Whitsunday Service.

We also noted the importance of the work being done by the Trussell Trust in providing food for those in need. Unfortunately the demand on the food bank is growing. We will therefore be holding a 'Tea for Trussell' as a one-off event to support this work. Details will follow.

Celebrating our members

It will soon be time for the church to celebrate its anniversary. A recent tradition has been to welcome individuals who have become members of the church during the previous twelve months and to recognise all our members and the commitment demonstrated to our congregation.

We value all those who are part of our congregation. We hope that by becoming a member the sense of belonging to our community is strengthened.


Smile Lines

GA MEETINGS HIGHLIGHTS

It seemed strange indeed to be attending Meetings where no Motions had been submitted for discussion. However, an Emergency Motion on the Illegal Migration Bill was received and discussed on the final morning. This Bill will remove rights to protection in the UK for vulnerable adults and children seeking safe haven.

The Motion asked our Chief Officer to join with other Church Leaders in publicly opposing the Bill as it stands. It also called on Unitarian congregations and individuals to raise these concerns with their MPs before the 3rd Reading of the Bill on 25 April 2023.

The Motion also called on the British Government to establish safe and accessible routes for all those seeking asylum. **The Motion was carried overwhelmingly**.

A theme running through the Meetings this year was that of Justice. The Anniversary Service preacher was Rev Winnie Gordon, Minister serving Unitarian New Meeting in central Birmingham. The singing was hearty and the central message was that we need to show up to fight for justice, because unless people like us care about this a great deal more, then nothing is going to improve.

The Penal & Social Action Panel slot continued this theme. The very convincing speaker, Chris Daw KC, a leading criminal defence barrister, who has represented clients in some of the most serious and headline-grabbing cases explained why only radical solutions could deal with our broken and failing justice system – a system at breaking point.

The beautiful and serene Quiet Room, prepared by Kingswood congregation, provided a brief haven for me in what seemed like tightly packed meetings. I was also fortunate to have a bedroom which overlooked the golf course, so a pleasant start to each morning.
