MESSAGE FROM ROCHDALE FOODBANK

Thank you for taking one of our FoodGiftBoxes and joining our growing network of FoodGiftBox Holders across the borough of Rochdale.



We are almost totally reliant on the goodwill, generosity and kindness of people living or working in Rochdale to allow Rochdale Foodbank to fulfil its purpose of ensuring that anyone who finds themselves without food in a crisis, can get a substantial food parcel quickly and freely - as long as they are referred by a reputable Agency.

So what you are doing is a crucial element of the Foodbank offering.

To put it in context, we are providing Food Parcels to around 450 households every month - giving out around 6000 kg of food. If you can picture a typical bag of food shopping weighs about 5kg, that's a lot of shopping! And it's every month.

You can find a list of items to collect on our website rochdale.foodbank.org.uk, but any ambient food is welcome: cereal, milk, sugar, tea, coffee, snacks, soup, veg, beans, tinned tomatoes, tinned potatoes, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, custard, rice pudding, pot noodles, fruit juice, tinned fruit - chocolate treats are good too!

We also like some toiletries - soap, shampoo, toothpaste, tooth brushes, feminine hygiene products.

Try to collect smaller packages of each - bulk packs are difficult to put in to a parcel and our clients have to carry them home!

If you have any questions, please get in touch and we will do our best to help you.

We have a team of around 12 volunteer drivers who are waiting to hear that your FoodGiftBox is full.

Keep on collecting!



Due to holidays we are meeting a week later than usual on Monday, 21st August.


