## REMINDER

## Supporting the work of our neighbouring Hostel

A few months ago, Joyce and I met with our neighbours at the hostel (the Revive Hub) to get to know



them and better understand the work they do. They're a not for profit community initiative company, offering men who are living on the streets (or those at risk of ending up on the streets), a safe place to stay.

As the company owners, Fez and his wife (a homelessness officer for 20years) have had to deal with some financial challenges but were optimistic that this would soon be resolved. The hostel provide shelter, a bed to sleep in, communal spaces to socialise in, along with basic kitchen and bathroom facilities, with a number of places across town offer food. In talking to Fez, he explained that what the men are most grateful for when they first arrive is the opportunity to get clean. The dignity in being clean is easily taken for granted. Water helps, but think of the products we use in our daily routines!

If being properly clean goes even a small way to restoring someone's dignity and self-worth, then let's show them that we care.

Could you contribute any of the following items - supermarket own brands are fine, they're often cruelty free too!

Spray Deodorant Face cloths (could be

made from towels no

longer needed)
