

HARITY COLLECTIONS NEWS

Over the Christmas period we select charities to make donations to. I've been requested by the General Council to update everyone on the amounts raised and then donated to particular charities. We are not a big congregation but the amounts we raised are good and this is all down to your individual generosity, thank you very much.

Toy & Gift Service - Retiring collection and monetary gifts totalled £114 which was then topped up by £36 from Church funds making £150, this was donated to the Rochdale Children's Moorland Home. See the thank you letter on the corridor notice board.

Carol & Christmas Day Services - Retiring collections in these services raised a total of £121 which was topped up by £29 from Church funds to £150, this was then donated to the Red Cross for best use as they endeavour to give relief in the many crises they are currently being forced to deal with.

Christmas Card Scheme - This year we raised a magnificent £75 for our current Church charity, Springhill Hospice. This together with the proceeds from the February film night of £125, bring the total raised so far to around £765.

GA Meetings 2024 Motions: Discuss with the congregation!

There are four motions that will be voted on at the meetings this year. This is a great time for the congregation to discuss the issues and inform the delegates so that they know how to vote. These motions are:

- 1. Artificial Intelligence (AI) calling for study and education around the subject
- 2. "No More Deaths" campaign Affirming support for an inquest into deaths in custody.
- 3. War in Gaza Call for a ceasefire
- 4. Increase the maximum number of motions considered at the GA meetings from 4 to unlimited.
