## INISTER'S MESSAGE



Dear friends

This month is possibly one of the busiest of the year, with much to prepare for. Homes to decorate and our church too, presents to be bought and wrapped and the feasting to be planned for. In amongst which, I'm sure they'll be Christmas lunches,

family gatherings and other festive celebrations too. I hope you enjoy them all and that the joy of the season fills your homes.

I hope you also find space to allow the simplicity of Christmas to settle in your hearts, that whatever has been stirring in you might be brought to birth in the coming year. May the joy, peace and gratitude of the season be with you and those you love.

Thank you to all of you who are collecting
Christmas food items for the Food Bank in
December. Where possible, further donations need
to be handed over by the end of November/early
December so the gift bags can be packed and ready
to hand out. Below are some key food bank facts,
shared by co-ordinator lain Wight:

- There is an increase in demand for our Emergency Food Parcels of at least 25%.
   Even in previous months, where energy costs have not been as high, the number of clients using the service has remained high at around 400 per month.
- This requires a supply of food of around 6000 kgs, most of which is still mercifully donated by the general public of Rochdale. But the food bank is still spending around £1000 per week 'topping up' our stock to ensure that people get the best on offer.
- Since April, over 600 clients have attended the foodbank for the very first time (around 25% of the total). This is suggestive of individuals and families living so close to the 'bread line', they sometimes tip over the edge. As we enter the winter, this will likely get worse as energy costs begin to bite, and demand may well rise to the levels of last winter 500 a month, which can only be met by an extra supply of 1500 kgs.

On behalf of Staff, Volunteers, and Trustees of Rochdale Foodbank, I thank Rochdale Unitarian Church for all its help and support.



## Carol Service – Sunday 17th December at 6.00 pm




## B OOK CIRCLE
